NGO



- Legally constituted organization created by natural or legal persons that operates independently from any government
- Do not form part of the government and are not conventional for-profit business
- Could be funded totally or partially by governments









NGO




- Different types

 - independent sector, volunteer sector, civil society, non-state actors (NSA's), ...












- More than 80% of all information contains some spatial reference ...
- An SDI is:
 - ... a framework of spatial data, metadata, users and tools that are interactively connected in order to use spatial data in an efficient and flexible way
 - the relevant base collection of technologies,
 policies and institutional arrangements that facilitate
 the availability of and access to spatial data





























- Each day NGOs

- Need for spatial data and services














- Specialized NGOs which activities are primarily connected with spatial data (e.g. EUROGI, ...)

 - Producers












- NGO in the activities in natural disaster risk management (DRM)
- Changing role in the different DRM phases















- NGO is in the environmental protection
- Changing role in the different EP phases














- Example from Croatia (2007)
 - State Geodetic Administration (SGA)
 and Croatian Scout Association (CSA)
 signed the agreement on cooperation
 to promote and support
 implementation of the state survey
 and cadastre
 - CSA participates in maintenance of official topographic maps and geodetic point networks
 - SGA donates maps for orientation competitions and gives sponsorship and other promotional materials














Summary
